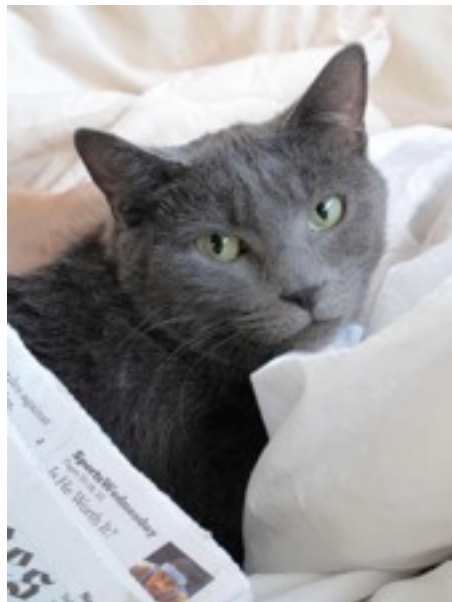
SMOKEY AND HER BANDITS

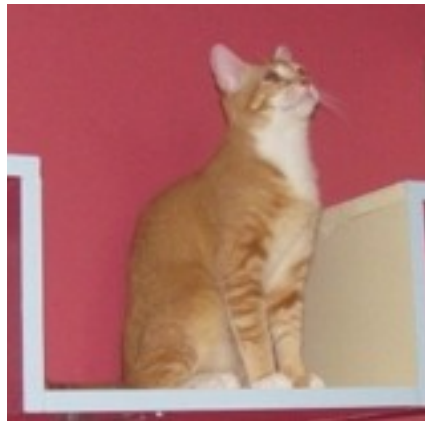

CHICKEN FEED

We have recently switched our litter of choice to chicken feed. This is exactly the same formula as "*The World's Best Cat Litter*", which is wonderful but quite expensive for the number of cats living at CASAS. We purchase the *Layer Feed Crumbles* in 50 pound bags from Agway in Orleans. We made one mistake and didn't look at the tag on the bottom of the bag so we ended up with Layer Feed Meal; the cats did not mind but it was more difficult to handle. Everybody switched without a fuss. We still use clay litter with our kittens and also with cats that we feel are allergic. Our friends at **Stop & Shop** are generous with donating their ripped bags and the wonderful **Butlers** are young and strong and don't mind handling even the 50 pound bags. We also offer stainless steel pans with no litter at all for those finicky kitties who don't like the feel of litter under their feet. We have reduced our very high litter budget. The 50 pound bags are \$12.00.

GENEROUS FRIENDS

Dr. Mike has the best friends. His houseguests for the holiday brought over a large amount of just the right kind of cat food and another friend that he reconnected with at a recent vet convention donated a dental scaler machine - value over a grand. Dr. Mike is thrilled and our resident cats who need dental work will be happy not to have to travel.

WISH LIST FOR CASAS

VOLUNTEERS to sit, comb, brush, socialize. No heavy lifting, scooping or feeding necessary unless you want. Willing to commit on a regular basis to a few hours a week to prepare our residents for adoption. We need someone who can commit to a regular morning @7-8 AM to feed, scoop, clean and/or someone to come on a regular basis @ 7 PM to sit and socialize with the cats so the night is not so long for them. We also need people to volunteer at special events, especially during Pet Appreciation Weekend which is always the last full weekend in September. We also need people who can stay at the shelter to answer phones and welcome visitors while we are out on errands, trapping, or on vet runs.

CAT LITTER - scoop and clay
TRASH BAGS -33 gallon and smaller kitchen bags

PAPER TOWELS - preferably Bounty
PET FOOD - Fancy Feast or Friskies wet food; Iams or Purina dry kitten food; Dry cat food - especially Innova, Hills Science Diet Sensitive Skin and Oral Care
